Location Kenosha County is situated on Interstate 94, midway between Chicago and Milwaukee. Most major Midwestern markets are within 400 miles of the region.

Rail Two class one railroads provide service to the area: Union Pacific and Canadian Pacific. Intermodal and Port operations located in the Chicago and Milwaukee area serve the east and west coasts. Commuter rail i savailable between Kenosha and downtown Chicago via Metra commuter rail line.
