## Fluency - help your mentee read fluently

Reading fluency is our goal. Fluency is reading smoothly, quickly, and with meaning while paying attention to punctuation and intonation.

## Practice reading fluently:

- 1. Read a sentence.
- 2. Point out the punctuation, special words, and meaning that make a difference in fluency.
- 3. Student reads the sentence to you.
- 4. Continue one sentence at a time until the end of the paragraph.
- 5. Student reads the paragraph to you fluently.
- 6. Listen for problems.
- 7. Discuss things that would help and model.
- 8. Student repeats the paragraph.
