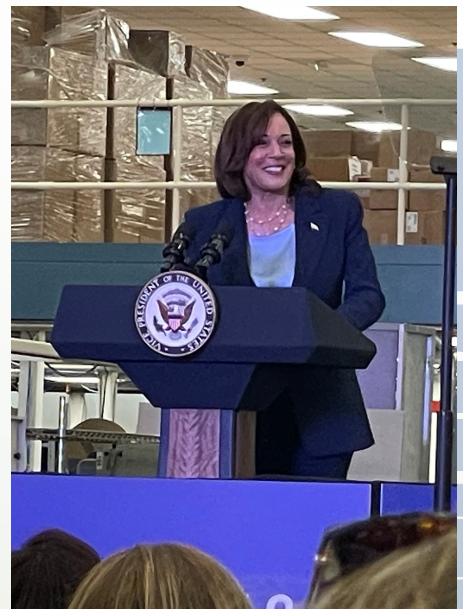

NOKIA & SIEMENS ANNOUNCE THEY WILL BEGIN MANUFACTURING AT SANMINA'S PLEASANT PRAIRIE PLANT

In July 2023, Vice President Kamala Harris was at Sanmina to announce that Nokia will begin manufacturing broadband network electronics in Kenosha County. The Finland-based telecommunications company is expected to begin production in 2024 and bring up to 200 new jobs to Kenosha County. Nokia is the first telecom company to begin manufacturing broadband electronics products in the United States.

In August 2023, German multinational technology conglomerate Siemens announced that it plans to manufacture photovoltaic string inverters at Sanmina's facility in Pleasant Prairie. Photovoltaics is the conversion of light into electricity (solar power) using semiconducting materials.

3. ULINE ADDING MORE HQ BUILDINGS TO ITS CORPORATE CAMPUS

Pleasant Prairie-based Uline, a shipping and business supplies provider, is continuing its rapid growth. The company plans to build a third and fourth office building in Pleasant Prairie just north of its corporate headquarters campus in the Prairie Highlands Corporate Park.

In January 2024, the company announced a three-story, 325,000 SF building that would employ 700 full-time workers and 20 part-time workers. Construction is scheduled to begin in April 2024, with occupancy expected in late 2025.

In March, Uline announced it had purchased land to build a fourth building. The three-story, 370,000-square-foot office building will employ 700 full time employees initially with enough office space for an additional 1,300 employees.



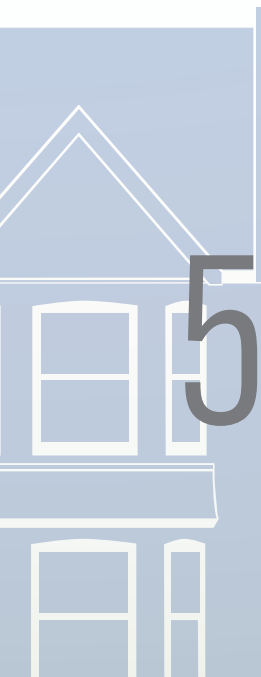
4. NICOLE RYF NAMED KABA PRESIDENT

Nicole Ryf joined KABA as its new President in July 2023.

Nicole is a nationally recognized economic development professional with more than 15 years of experience in public, private, and nonprofit organizations. Over the course of her career, she has worked in multiple states at the local, county, regional, and state levels, including the Texas Governor's Office of Economic Development. Most recently, Nicole served as the Executive Director at the Waukesha County Center for Growth.

5. HARIBO ANNOUNCES EXPANSION PLANS

With production underway at its U.S. candy plant in Pleasant Prairie, HARIBO of America is already designing a second phase of equal size, with two more buildings that could bring the total plant size to about two million square feet. The second phase, which is in the planning stages, would bring 400 more jobs to the facility in addition to the 400 already expected for completed buildings.

NEXUS PHARMACEUTICALS TO DOUBLE ITS WORKFORCE AS IT PLANS MORE PRODUCTION LINES



Nexus Pharmaceuticals aims to grow its Pleasant Prairie footprint as it adds drug lines. The manufacturer of generic drugs and other products left space for expansion when they selected the 16-acre site. About 85 members of its 200-person workforce are located there. Nexus currently has two vial-filling lines at the site. Future additions could include oncology products such as chemotherapy drugs as well as vaccination products. As these and other expansions occur, Nexus expects to have at least 400 employees in fewer than 10 years.

WESTROCK SITES NEW FACILITY IN KENOSHA COUNTY

WestRock Company, a leading sustainable paper and packaging solutions provider, announced in January 2024 plans to build an advanced corrugated converting facility Kenosha County. The state-of-the-art facility will be located at the LogistiCenter at Pleasant Prairie. The project's Pleasant Prairie site, previously a We Energies power plant, was successfully acquired by the development company Dermody Properties in September 2023. In collaboration with the Village, the site is undergoing a comprehensive redevelopment to bring about transformative changes.

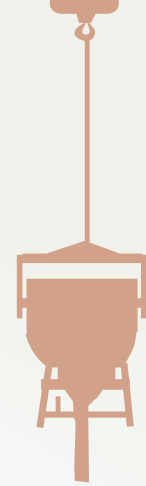

LAKEVIEW TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY BREAKS GROUND

KABA broke ground in October 2023 on the new LakeView Technology Academy at the Kenosha Innovation Neighborhood. KABA and its Foundation are excited to deliver a new, state-of-the-art high school specifically designed to accommodate and support their unique STEM-focused programming. The new 48,602 SF facility will also empower the school to serve more non-LakeView students within the Kenosha Unified School District and expand its programming to include areas such as automated manufacturing, CNC, and the trades. Classes are expected to begin in January 2025.

9. KENOSHA INNOVATION CENTER BREAKS GROUND

In February 2024, the City of Kenosha held a groundbreaking ceremony for a new \$23.5-million facility that will serve as the future Kenosha Innovation Center, located on the site of the Kenosha Innovation Neighborhood (KIN). The Innovation Center, a three-story, 64,000 SF building, will be situated on a 3.5-acre portion of the KIN, adjacent to the planned greenway corridor that will run through the site. The facility is expected to be completed in summer 2025 and will include leasable tenant space, as well as event and meeting space open for community use.

10. SALEM BUSINESS PARK ADDS ANOTHER TENANT: KEEN EDGE

Keen Edge Co. joined the roster of companies at the Salem Business Park in the Village of Salem Lakes. The outdoor power equipment, engines, parts and accessories supplier built a new 50,000 SF warehouse space that was complete in Q4 2023. The Salem Business Park was a collaborative development by KABA, Kenosha County, and the Village of Salem Lakes. There are now six companies doing business in the park.

KABA FOUNDATION

In 1996, the Kenosha Area Business Alliance Foundation, Inc. was formed to develop educational initiatives in collaboration with local Kenosha schools to increase graduation and educational attainment rates, improve the overall quality of education, and foster the best school system in the state.

The Foundation lends its support to many initiatives championed by other organizations that we feel will have a positive impact on the educational systems in Kenosha County. One of those initiatives is Building Our Future, which is a network of community leaders representing all sectors of Kenosha County committed to improving student outcomes. Another is LakeView Technology Academy. LakeView is a specialty high school preparing students to enter STEM-related fields. In 2023, KABA broke ground on a new 48,602 SF building for LakeView in the Kenosha Innovation Neighborhood. KUSD and Gateway Technical College will lease the building from the KABA Foundation. The Foundation is excited to deliver this beautiful new building in the heart of Kenosha in the first quarter of 2025. The new facility's central location will make access easier for all KUSD students.

HELPING KENOSHA COUNTY COMPANIES **GROW**

Using a combination of state and local resources, KABA helps companies navigate financing options and incentive programs so they can continue to grow and thrive in Kenosha County.

REVOLVING LOAN FUND (RLF) PROGRAM

KABA has helped hundreds of companies to relocate or expand in Kenosha County through its portfolio of community revolving loan funds, which total \$30+ million. These funds are used to provide low-cost financing to companies creating jobs by expanding or establishing a new facility in Kenosha County.

Loan terms and conditions vary by RLF and are tailored for individual projects. The RLFs are funded by a variety of sources, including the City of Kenosha, Kenosha County, Village of Pleasant Prairie, and other state and federal sources.

The purpose of including KABA RLF funds is to provide an opportunity for businesses that may not be eligible for financing through a conventional lender or private means. Each RLF has certain loan requirements that must be met in order for the business to be eligible. KABA will work together with the business to ensure loan compliance requirements are met.

In 2023, KABA provided \$1.2 million in funding to support a 50,000 SF facility and equipment expansion at LMI Packaging Solutions.

KENOSHA COUNTY HIGH IMPACT FUND

The Kenosha County High Impact Fund administered by KABA, helps secure high quality economic development projects. "High Impact" developments are those which create at least 50 new, high-paying jobs or have a capital investment of at least \$3 million.

Since its inception, the High Impact Fund has contributed to the creation of **2,100 new jobs** and **\$361 million** in new private investment.


